B. Meetings

a. Meetings held

• 2018 IGU Regional Conference, Quebec City, Canada (6-10 August)

The annual meeting of the Commission was held as part of the IGU Regional Conference in Quebec City at which a total of 19 papers were presented in the following sessions:

Hydrological processes between fire and ice I (5 papers)

Water Sustainability – open session (4 papers)

Hydrological processes between fire and ice II (5 papers)

Human and water – managing the impacts (5 papers)

The general consensus among Commission members was that the sessions were interesting and successful in stimulating multidisciplinary and cross-country collaboration among members.

Supported by endorsement letters from the Chair an IGU travel grant was provided to prof. L. Zaharia and a partially funded volunteer position for her PhD student Ms. G. Morosanu.

Responding to a request for feedback the chair addressed a number of concerns members voiced regarding the organisation of the event by a professional company in an email to prof. Guy-Dorion of the LOC (for details see Newsletter no. 18 at www.igu-water.org).

The Commission also held its annual business meeting. Among other possible follow-up publications from the conference were discussed and, following the offer by prof. Zaharia, Bucharest (Romania) as the venue for the next annual meeting agreed upon.

• IGU Thematic Conference, Moscow, June 2018

Following an initiative of prof. W. Kollossov the IGU Thematic Conference: Practical Geography and XXI Century Challenges was held in in Moscow, 4–6 June 2018 supported by the Commission. The conference was dedicated to the 100th anniversary of the foundation of the Institute of Geography of the Russian Academy of Sciences (IGRAS) as largest geographical research organisation in Russia and attracted 750 participants representing 36 countries. As part of one of the eight themes of the conference (Theme 2: Environmental Challenges) our Commission held the following sessions headed by proffs. N. Frolova and M. Bolgov and attended by a number of Commission members:

- 1. Water resources in the conditions of climate change
- 2. Water management: modern principles, methods, results
- 3. Water pollution and health impacts
- 4. Extreme hydrological events










• Joint Leopoldina-ASSAf Conference on sustainable use of abandoned mines (28-30 Nov. 2017), Johannesburg, South Africa

The South African members of the Commission together with the National Academy of Science Leopoldina (Germany) and the Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf) jointly organised an international conference on the sustainable use of abandoned mines in the SADC region, where water and its protection from mining-related pollution played a key role. Having attracted some 100 hand-picked participants a key topic was the conversion of underground mines into pumped hydro storage schemes for the first time bringing together five research teams from four different countries where this innovative concept is currently explored. • Intern. Symposium: Sustainable Urban Renewal, Chongqing (China), 12 June 2018

Lin International Engineering Consulting (China) Co. Ltd., in Chongqing (China) on 12 June 2018. Aspect relating to water sustainability included urban waste water management, mine water management, and water quality aspects in cities.

c. Meetings planned

• Annual Commission Meeting 2019, Bucharest (Romania)

Following the offer of Prof. Zaharia to host next year's annual Commission meeting at the University of Bucharest members present at the Quebec business meeting unanimously agreed to hold the 2019 meeting in Romania. The exact dates, times and venues will be determined in collaboration with the host university and be communicated to members together with the call for abstracts in due course.

• IGU Congress 2020, Istanbul (Turkey)

Responding to a request by the Chair Dr. Yavuz, as newly joined member from Turkey, indicated his active support of the Commission in preparation for the 2020 IGU Congress in Istanbul (Turkey).

C. Networking

a. Collaboration within the Commission and with other IGU Commissions and Task Forces

(1) Hydrological glossary

Following a proposal by Gabriela Morosanu (Romania) the idea of the Commission contributing to a hydrological glossary was launched and enthusiastically discussed among member via email correspondence. Latching on to the original initiative by the Hydrology Group of the Scientific Committee of EGEA (European Association of Geography Students) to create a wiki platform-based glossary several members forwarded existing glossaries as well as links to multilingual online versions. The idea is generally supported while members are aware that duplication should be avoided. On the Commission's website two published glossaries are available in pdf also providing a link to the multilingual online glossary mentioned above.

(2) Joint book project

Following the chair's request for responses to a proposed book project (a Springer template was sent out as an example) a lively discussion pursued in response to Prof. D. Karthe proposing to explore the viability of a dedicated volume on 'Hydrogeography and Water Sustainability' as a

seemingly underrepresented topic in current hydrological and geographical literature. The discussion is still ongoing with many members having expressed keen interest to contribute. The discussion mainly revolves around scope and target audiences as well as style and contents of a possible joint book produced by the Commission aiming to fill a gap rather than competing with existing works.

b. Collaboration with other IGU Commissions and Task Forces

For this period no related activities are to be reported.

c. Collaboration with other international or inter- and multidisciplinary groups

A joint proposal of South African members of the Commission to UNESCO-IGCP was submitted together with scientists from six other African countries aiming to investigate environmental and health effects of abandoned mines in Africa.

A joint symposium with the China-Africa Water Institute was held in Chongqing (China) (see above mentioned conference).

d. Cooperative efforts with ISC and CIPHS

The document outlining the vision of the newly formed International Science Council (ISC) was distributed and contents noted. A call for contributing to reviewing proposals was answered by the chair and distributed.

Olga also organised the Commission's first meeting in Latin America (Buenos Aires, 2005) overcoming fiscal constraint plaguing the country through successfully soliciting support from a range of national and international institutions.

Preparing for her departure from active involvement well in advance Olga was able to engage new young researchers to ensure the continued representation of Argentina on the Commission securing an important gateway for members to collaborate with non-English speaking colleagues in Latin America.
